

College Guidelines for MD/MS Students

1. Duration of Course

- MD/MS programme consists of three years of residency training after MBBS.
- Students must complete the full duration to be eligible for the final examination.

2. Attendance Requirements (NMC-Mandated)

- Minimum 80% attendance in all academic activities and clinical postings.
- Mandatory participation in ward rounds, OPD duties, OT/Procedure duties (where applicable), emergency duties and teaching activities.
- Any leave beyond the permitted limit must be compensated by extension of training.
- PG residents must remain available on campus during on-call duties.

3. Professional Conduct

- MD/MS residents must:
 - o Maintain professional integrity, empathy, and ethical behaviour.
 - Adhere to NMC Code of Medical Ethics.
 - Show respect towards patients, colleagues, nursing staff and faculty.
 - Avoid any behaviour amounting to misconduct, harassment or ragging (punishable as per NMC/Ragging Act).

4. Clinical Responsibilities

- Proper history taking, clinical examination, patient work-up, differential diagnosis and treatment planning.
- Active participation in patient care: OPD, IPD, emergency services, ICU care, OT/Procedures (for surgical branches).
- Maintenance of accurate case records, progress notes and discharge summaries.
- All procedures must be performed under faculty supervision as per training level.

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5. Academic Programme (Mandatory Under NMC)

Each PG student must participate in:

- Seminars
- Journal Clubs
- Case Presentations
- Mortality & Morbidity meetings
- Inter-departmental teaching sessions
- Grand Rounds
- Thesis protocol presentations and periodic reviews

Completion and documentation of all academic work is mandatory.

6. Thesis / Dissertation (As per NMC PG Regulations)

- Submission of **thesis protocol** within the timeline notified by the ABVMU.
- Prior approval by **Institutional Ethics Committee (IEC)** is mandatory.
- The thesis must involve original research, data analysis, and scientific writing.
- NMC-required process:
 - Protocol submission → IEC approval → Data collection → Progress review
 → Final submission.
- Timely submission of thesis is essential for eligibility to appear for final examinations.

7. Logbook Requirements

- Each PG resident must maintain a **E-logbook** documenting:
 - o Clinical cases seen
 - Procedures performed/assisted
 - o Academic activities attended
 - Research progress
- The logbook must be periodically checked and signed by faculty.
- Submission of a complete, certified logbook is compulsory for exam eligibility.

8. Leave Rules (NMC Norms)

- PG students are entitled to leave as per NMC/University/Institution rules:
 - o Casual Leave
 - Academic Leave (CME, Workshop, Conference) Only when Presenting Paper (for 1 Poster & 1 Paper presentation only)
 - o Maternity Leave/Paternity Leave as per Government norms
- Leaves in excess of permissible limits must be compensated by extension of training.

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 Residents must apply for leave through proper channel (Guide → HOD → Principal/Dean).

Please note that even sanctioned leaves will be counted towards overall attendance, and if the minimum required attendance is not met, the student will not be permitted to appear in the university examination

9. Examination Eligibility Criteria

To appear for final MD/MS examination, the student must have:

- Required attendance ($\geq 80\%$).
- Presented 1 Poster & 1 Paper in State or National level conference
- 1 Paper published or accepted in Indexed journal
- BCBR Completion Certificate
- BCLS / ACLS Certificate with validity till exam date
- Completed and approved thesis.
- Completed e-logbook with faculty certification.
- Satisfactory performance in internal assessments.
- No pending disciplinary action.

10. Research, Publications & CME

- PG residents are encouraged (in some universities mandated) to:
 - o Present paper/poster at conferences.
 - o Publish one research paper in an indexed journal.
 - o Attend CME activities and skill workshops.
- These contribute to academic growth and may be required for university eligibility.

11. Ethical & Patient Safety Guidelines

- Follow NMC-prescribed ethics and patient safety protocols:
 - o Informed consent before procedures.
 - o Confidentiality of patient data.
 - o Evidence-based treatment.
 - Antimicrobial stewardship.
 - Biomedical waste management.
 - Hand hygiene and infection control practices.

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12. Hostel & Campus Conduct

- PG residents staying in hostels must follow institutional hostel rules.
- Neat formal attire with a white apron/lab coat during academic hours.
- Short clothes are not allowed outside the hostel room & also in the campus.
- Visitors, quiet-hours, and discipline rules to be followed strictly.
- Any indiscipline inside hostel/hospital campus may lead to disciplinary action.

Discipline in Hostel

1. Quiet Hours:

O Quiet hours are enforced after 11:00 PM. Loud music or group activities that disturb others are prohibited.

2. Cleanliness & Maintenance:

- O Students must maintain cleanliness in rooms and common areas.
- O Damaging hostel property will attract fines and possible disciplinary action.
- O Students will be responsible for the security of their luggage

3. Visitors:

- O Visitors are allowed only in designated areas and during specified hours.
- O Visitors are not allowed inside the rooms.
- Overnight stay of guests is not permitted.

Mess Rules

1. General guidelines

- o Food in the mess will be served only during the prescribed hours.
- O No food packing is allowed from the mess.
- O Students must be properly dressed in the mess.
- O Maintain discipline and decorum while in the dining area. Loud conversations, shouting, or group disturbances are not allowed.
- Wasting food is strictly discouraged. Take only as much as needed.
 Repeated wastage may attract warnings or fines.

2. Restricted Activities

- Mess utensils are not to be taken outside the dining area under any circumstances.
- O Playing music, watching videos, or making video calls in the mess is prohibited.

13. Prohibited Activities

• Substance Use:

• Use of alcohol, tobacco, or drugs is strictly banned. Violation will result in expulsion from the hostel and college.

• Electrical Appliances:

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O Unauthorised use of electrical appliances such as heaters, induction cookers, etc., is not permitted.

• Groupism or Political Activities:

• Any political, religious, or group activities disturbing the peace or discipline of the hostel are banned.

14. Compliance

- All PG students must submit an undertaking that they will abide by NMC regulations and institutional policies.
- Repeated violations may result in warning, withholding of stipend, disciplinary action, or extension of training period.

General Guidelines

- No procession is allowed on the campus.
- No two-wheelers or four-wheelers are permitted on the campus. If found, the vehicle will be confiscated and will only be released to parents/guardians after fulfilling the imposed penalty.
- Students must regularly check college notice boards/emails/WhatsApp for updates.
- Participation in academic, sports, and extracurricular activities is encouraged but must not interfere with academics.
- Any change in personal details (phone, address) must be promptly updated in the student records.

In case I fail to abide by and fail to fulfil my financial liabilities, my hostel deposit can be confiscated. I agree to face any other disciplinary action as imposed by the authorities.
